MCTS NEXT Receives Approval

We're excited to announce that 'MCTS NEXT' – the agency's first comprehensive redesign project in decades – received approval from the Milwaukee County Board of Supervisors on September 24.

A lot has changed over the years, especially when it comes to the locations of job centers, shopping destinations, schools and homes. This means transit services must continue to evolve in order to meet the community's needs.

We spent nearly three years conducting a complete review of the entire transit system. Planners examined and evaluated **every route and bus stop** across our service area to identify opportunities for improvements, enhanced efficiency and faster service.

A massive public outreach effort – including 13 open house events and more than 40 stakeholder meetings – resulted in hundreds of comments and thousands of interactions with passengers, bus drivers, businesses, community groups, and elected officials. Additionally, MCTS received input from the Milwaukee County Office on African American Affairs (OAAA). This valuable feedback helped shape plans that will advance racial equity by improving access for people of color to employment, education, healthcare, grocery stores and other essential destinations.

MCTS NEXT is cost-neutral, meaning it was created based on our existing budget to ensure that operating costs remain consistent. We will now prepare a schedule for making incremental changes starting in 2021.

Traveling Safe During Flu Season & COVID-19

As COVID-19 cases continue to rise and with the arrival of flu season, we all need to take steps to prevent becoming ill. Here are a few tips for when you are riding on MCTS buses (or traveling anywhere):

- Wear a mask over your mouth and nose! If you forgot your mask, please take one from our on-board dispenser.
- When boarding and leaving the bus, use hand sanitizer containing at least 60 percent alcohol (available on each bus).
- When you arrive at your destination, wash your hands with soap and water for at least 20 seconds.

New Bus Route to Amazon Facility in Oak Creek Links to New Jobs

Amazon, the nation's leading online retailer, recently expanded its operations with a fulfillment center in Oak Creek and it is ready to hire! And MCTS is ready to link Milwaukee County residents to these new job openings.


Route 81 (Amazon-Oak Creek) began service on October 11, operating seven days a week between the intersections of N. 35th Street & W. Fond du Lac Avenue in Milwaukee and S. 13th Street & W. Ryan Road in Oak Creek. Buses have stops on portions of W. Fond du Lac Avenue, N. 17th Street, W. Walnut Street, N. and S. 6th Street. The new Amazon facility brings 1,500 jobs to the area.

In addition to operating along those busy corridors, Route 81 also connects with 16 existing MCTS bus routes. Passengers who use **Routes 12, 14, 19, 21, 22, 30, 31, 33, 35, 56, 57, 60, 80, GoldLine, BlueLine and PurpleLine** can transfer to Route 81 from neighborhoods all across the County.



MCTS worked closely with officials from Amazon and the City of Oak Creek to make sure the route's schedule synchronizes with employee shift times at the facility.

Passengers who use Routes 12, 14, 19, 21, 22, 30, 31, 33, 35, 56, 57, 60, 80, GoldLine, BlueLine and PurpleLine can transfer to Route 81 and go directly to the new Amazon Fulfillment Center in Oak Creek.

Keeping Healthy and Virus Free this Winter

The spread of COVID-19 is expected to continue this winter season. Here at MCTS, we'll do our part to keep you safe with cleaned and sanitized buses. We need each of you to do your part to prevent the further spread of COVID-19, the flu and other viruses.

Take steps like:

- Wear a mask or face covering. Masks are required onboard all MCTS buses.
- ► When on board, practice social distancing. Give yourself and fellow passengers space.
- Stay home if you are feeling sick, including having chills, body aches or a fever.
- Wash your hands frequently.
- If you do not have access to soap and water, use hand sanitizer.
- Cover your sneeze or cough no matter where you are!


Did you know...

- Even if you hug someone and you both have masks on you may still contract COVID?
- Wearing a mask just over your mouth and not your nose You can still contract COVID?
- You can spread COVID 2 days before you ever show symptoms?
- You can be positive for COVID even if you don't have symptoms?
- Droplets from your breath can remain suspended in the air for minutes to hours and breathed in by others?
- COVID spreads from person-to-person more easily than the flu?
- The CDC does not recommend wearing masks with exhalation valves or vents?
- Face shields alone are not an effective substitute for masks?
- Masks should have at least 2 layers of fabric and fit **snugly** against the sides of your face?

This Seat Is Reserved for Rosa Parks

MCTS is keeping a seat open on every bus in the fleet from Tuesday. December 1 through Thursday, December 3. Each reserved seat will include a red rose and a special sign that features Parks' photo and a message about her courageous act.


It was on December 1, 1955, that Mrs. Parks was arrested after refusing to give up her seat to a white man in Montgomery, Alabama. Her small act of civil disobedience led to a landmark Supreme Court ruling that outlawed segregation on public transportation.



This is the fifth year that MCTS has organized an on-board tribute to Rosa Parks. The annual effort has gained widespread attention on social media and inspired transit agencies across the country to implement similar initiatives.

Since 1984, Milwaukee's Marcus Center for the Performing Arts has hosted its Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Birthday Celebration for the civil rights icon. MCTS is proud to be a sponsor of this treasured community event.
