MCTS Salutes Rosa Parks

As part of our annual tradition for the past six years, MCTS will save a seat for Rosa Parks Wednesday, Dec. 1 through Friday, Dec. 3. On all 360 buses, each reserved seat will include a red rose and a special sign that features Parks' photo and a message about her courageous act.

It was on December 1, 1955, Parks was arrested after refusing to give up her seat to a white man in Montgomery, Ala. Her small act of civil disobedience led to a landmark Supreme Court ruling that outlawed segregation on public transportation.

We ask that you help us honor her by not sitting in these seats with the special "reserved" sign featuring Parks.

Celebrate New Year's Eve Safely with MCTS and Miller Lite Free Rides

Miller Lite Free Rides for New Year's Eve returns! Free bus rides on all routes will begin at **8:00 p.m. on Friday, December 31** until the end of regularly scheduled service. **Masks are required to be worn on all buses.**

Several popular bus routes – **GreenLine** (Bayshore – Airport), **BlueLine** (Fond du Lac), **PurpleLine** (27th Street), **GoldLine** (UWM - Wisconsin) and **Routes 14** (Humboldt - Forest Home), **18** (National - Greenfield), **19** (King Drive - S. 13th), **30** (Sherman - Wisconsin) will have extended service until 4:00 a.m.

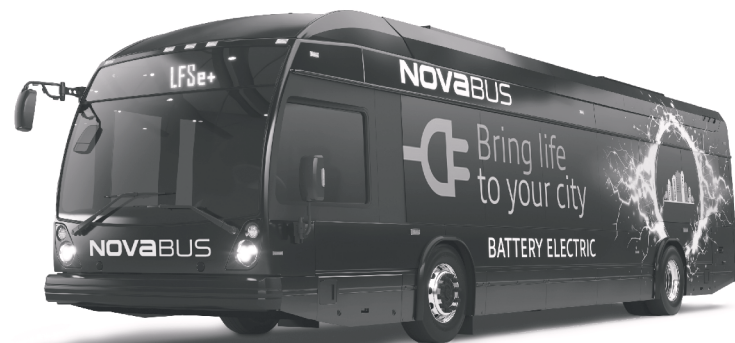

The Future Is Electric! East-West Bus Rapid Transit Line

While much of our focus in 2021 has been on introducing MCTS NEXT, we've also made progress with our plans for the East-West Bus Rapid Transit (BRT) project. The East-West BRT is a nine-mile transit line that will allow MCTS to connect major

employment, education and recreation destinations through downtown Milwaukee, Marquette University, Milwaukee's Near West Side, Wauwatosa and the Milwaukee Regional Medical Center. Check out our 2021 timeline of activities:

March 2021

Manufacturer for Battery Electric Buses Selected

Nova Bus will produce up to 15 electric buses for use on MCTS's East-West BRT Line.

MCTS awarded a contract to Nova Bus who will build Milwaukee County's first battery-electric buses. Nova Bus, a leading North American transportation manufacturer that's part of the Volvo Group, will produce up to 15 all-electric LFS+ buses for MCTS. The first 11 state-of-the-art vehicles will run exclusively on the upcoming East-West Bus Rapid Transit (BRT) line; four additional vehicles will be used along regular routes.

June 2021

MCTS Breaks Ground on Construction of BRT Stations

Dignitaries representing the City of Milwaukee, the Village of Wauwatosa, Milwaukee County, the State of Wisconsin and the U.S. Government helped MCTS break ground on our first-ever Bus Rapid Transit line.

In addition to the groundbreaking in June, the Federal Transportation Administration, announced that MCTS will receive a \$2.1 million allocation of American Rescue Plan funding for the East-West BRT project.

September 2021

A Glimpse of the Future

This is an artist rendering of what the BRT stations will look like once completed in the fall of 2022.

Along Wisconsin Avenue, parts of Bluemound Road and N. 92nd Street, the stations will be located at major transfer stops. The stations will be designed to be level with the bus doors — so it will be easier for everyone to board, including those who use mobility devices. Construction is expected to be completed by Fall of 2022.

Coming in 2022

Once completed, in addition to providing critical access to the area's biggest job, medical and entertainment centers, the East-West BRT will also take thousands of cars off Milwaukee area roads, reducing congestion and enhancing our environment.
